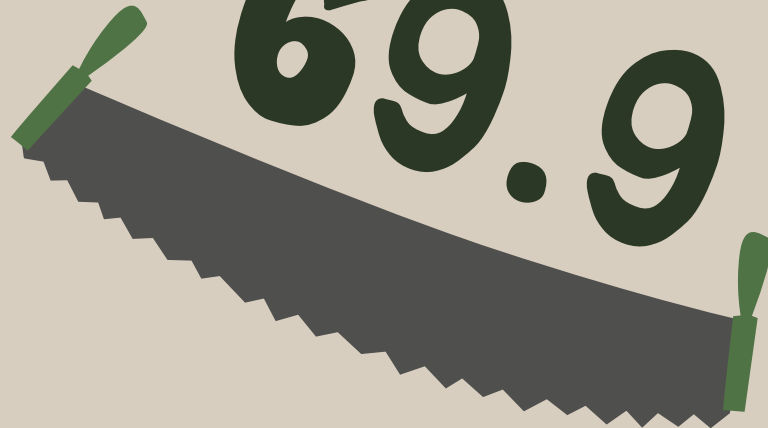

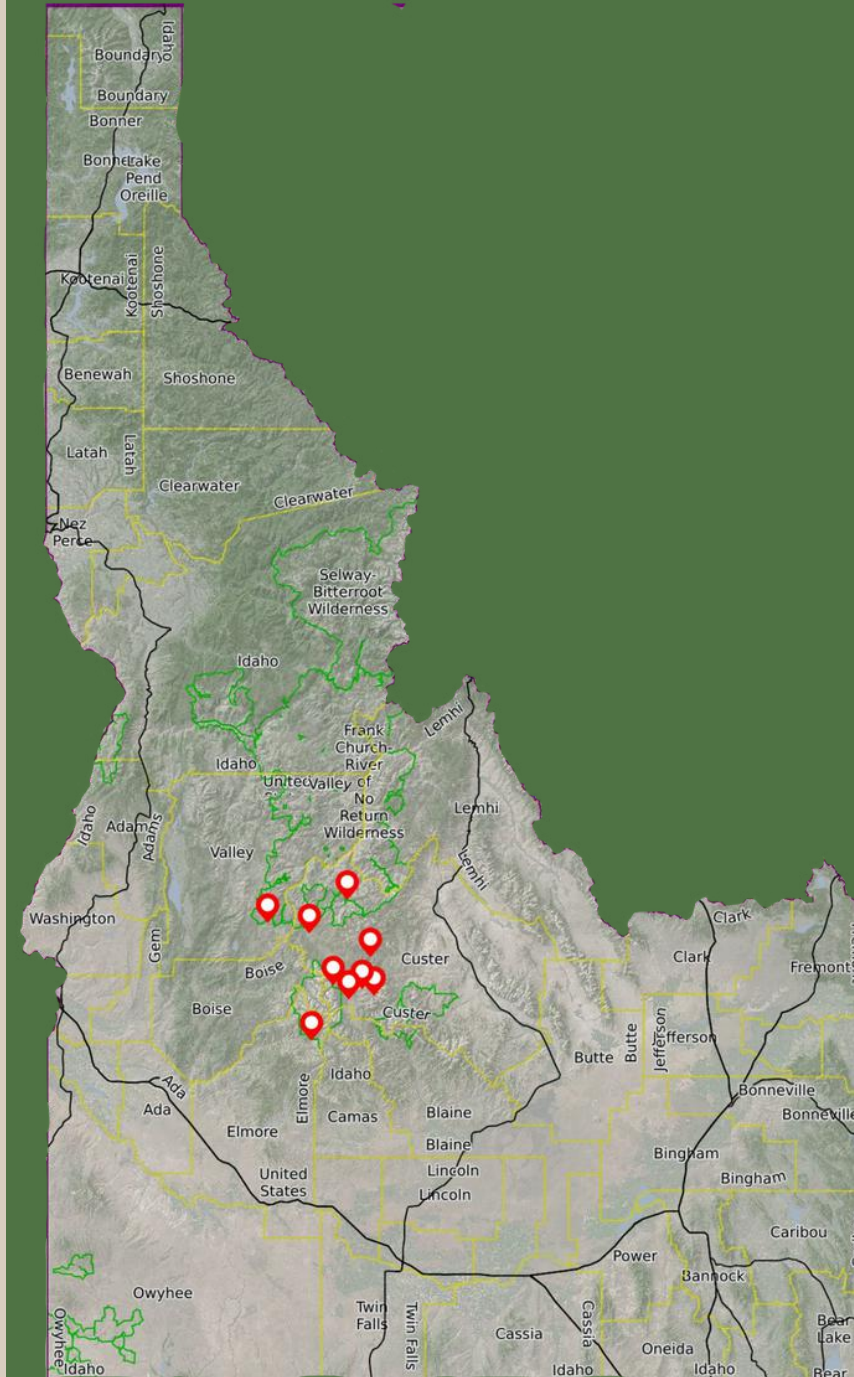

In collaboration with the Flourish Foundation, we spent two weeks on the Garden Isle of Kaua'i.

While in Kauai we worked on various trail-related projects across the island. From the Pihea Trail high up on the cliffs of Waimea Canyon to the densely jungled Hanakāpī'ai Trail on the Nā Pali Coast we worked with local government and community leaders to improve trail conditions for locals and visitors alike. While on Kaua'i our group contributed 662 hours of volunteer time and maintained 2.3 miles of trail.

PUG received \$10,015 in donations for our project in Kauai. Revenue and expenses for this project are kept separate from our 2022 Financials.
